CALL TO ORDER, QUORUM DETERMINED, MEETING DECLARED OPEN, RECOGNITION OF GUESTS AND VISITORS

Mr. Kirkpatrick, Vice- Chairman of the Sherman Economic Development Corporation, called the meeting to order at 7:32 A.M., declared a quorum present, meeting declared open, and recognized the following guests and visitors: Mr. Brian Grisham and Mr. Tim Taraba of Adami, Lindsey & Company, L.L.P.

CONSIDER FOR APPROVAL THE MINUTES FOR THE FOLLOWING MEETING

Motion was made by Mr. Sild and seconded by Mr. Shields to approve the regular scheduled meeting minutes of April 12, 2016. Motion was approved unanimously.

AUDITOR'S REPORT

Mr. Grisham and Mr. Taraba presented the Independent Auditor's Report for year ended September 30, 2015. Mr. Grisham noted that the report found SEDCO in "good financial condition."

FINANCIALS

Mrs. Lawrence presented the financials for the quarter ended March 31, 2016 and noted that the net fund balance is \$6.8 million, with \$9.4 million in outstanding commitments.

Mrs. Lawrence presented the Investment Report for the quarter ended March 31, 2016 and noted that the book value is \$5.7 million, a \$255,496 change from the prior quarter. Mrs. Lawrence also mentioned that the weighted average yield is 0.46%.

Motion to approve the financials and the Investment Report for the quarter ended March 31, 2016 was made by Mr. Shields and seconded by Mr. Sild. Motion was approved unanimously.

CONSIDER APPROVAL OF THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTIONS

Mrs. Lawrence presented a resolution of the Sherman Economic Development Corporation, naming authorized representatives to invest SEDCO funds with AmeriState Bank.

Mrs. Lawrence also presented a resolution amending authorized representatives for the Texas Local Government Investment Pool (TexPool).

Motion was made by Mr. Sild and seconded by Mr. Shields to approve the resolution for authorized representatives concerning AmeriState Bank and the resolution amending authorized representatives for the Texas Local Government Investment Pool (TexPool). Motion was approved unanimously.

ECONOMIC BAROMETER REPORT (April 2016)

Mr. Gadek referred to the EBR report in the board packet and discussed the following: The overall City Building Permits Value is up 14.55% from April 2015, and the number of utility customers has risen 2.38% from year-to-date 2015. The Sherman Sales Tax Proceeds is up 22.28% from April 2015, and Sherman's unemployment rate is 3.8%.

Mr. Plotnik noted the Commercial and Industrial City Building Permits Value is up 250.17% from year-to-date 2015.

May 1st was the start of an agreement with Texas Aviation Partners on the marketing of the North Texas Regional Airport in partnership with Grayson County, Denison Development Alliance, and SEDCO. Texas Aviation Partners will market to targets that specialize in aviation and have begun the process for the attraction of new jobs and investments within our region.
