CALL TO ORDER, QUORUM DETERMINED, MEETING DECLARED OPEN, RECOGNITION OF GUESTS AND VISITORS

Mr. Sild called the meeting to order at 7:31 a.m., declared a quorum present, meeting declared open, recognition of guests and visitors. Ms. Ghaemi introduced SEDCO's new temporary employee, Dondra Kendall.

CONSIDER FOR APPROVAL THE MINUTES FOR THE FOLLOWING MEETINGS

Motion was made by Mr. Douglass and seconded by Mrs. Bates to approve the Board Meeting minutes of June 12, 2018.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

The Sherman Economic Development Corporation will hold an Executive Session pursuant to the provisions of the Open Meetings Law, Chapter 551, Government Code, Vernon's Texas Code Annotated, in accordance with the authority contained in the following sections:

Section 551.087 – Economic Development: Discussion concerning the following Projects: Tackleberry, Snow Ball, Atlas, Breeze, Dahl, Form, Kevin, Plan 4, Starlight, Combi, Root Ball

Section 551.072 - Real Property: Discussion concerning projects: FS4, Northgate Drive, PP2, PP6, Truck

Section 551.074 – Personnel Matters: To deliberate the appointment, employment, evaluation, reassignment, duties, discipline, or dismissal of a public officer or employee.

The open meeting recessed in executive session at 7:32 a.m.

RECONVENE OPEN MEETING AND CONSIDER ITEMS DISCUSSED IN EXECUTIVE SESSION Mr. Sild reconvened the open meeting at 8:04 a.m.

Mr. Sild recommended the approval of assigning Mrs. Jones as the authorized signer on the signature card for the SEDCO checking account at Landmark Bank.

Motion to approve this authorization was made by Mr. Douglass and seconded by Mrs. Bates.

Mrs. Jones asked Mr. Shelby to discuss the Ingress and Egress Easement and Private Road Maintenance Agreement between SEDCO and Sherman RE, LLC, which will provide a 60'-wide easement located on the east side of Progress Park II. Mr. Shelby recommended the approval of this agreement.

Motion to approve the Ingress and Egress Easement and Private Road Maintenance Agreement between Sherman Economic Development Corporation and Sherman RE, LLC was made by Mrs. Bates and seconded by Mr. Douglass. Motion was approved unanimously.

Mrs. Jones recommended an Addendum to the Sherman Economic Development Corporation Economic Development Performance Agreement with Combicut, Inc., to amend section 10.14 of the Agreement to move the termination date to August 31, 2019.

Motion to approve the Addendum to the Sherman Economic Development Corporation Economic Development Performance Agreement with Combicut, Inc. was made by Mr. Kirkpatrick and seconded by Mrs. Bates. Motion was approved unanimously.

Mrs. Jones recommended the approval of a Sherman Economic Development Corporation Economic Development Performance Agreement with GlobiTech Incorporated. The agreement states that GlobiTech will invest \$47,500,000 in capital improvements and create 32 new full time positions for a total of 247 full time positions at its 200 FM 1417 West facility, and SEDCO will provide a \$1,900,000 incentive upon proof that the conditions have been met.

Motion to approve the Economic Development Performance Agreement with GlobiTech Incorporated was made by Mr. Douglass and seconded by Mr. Kirkpatrick. Motion was approved unanimously.

ECONOMIC BAROMETER REPORT (June 2018)

Ms. Ghaemi presented the Economic Barometer Report and noted the following: City Building Permits is down 21.05% in comparison to June 2017 but is up 11.14% YTD; sales tax proceeds had an increase of 7.75% from June 2017; City Water customers increased 1.42%; and Sherman's unemployment rate is 3.1% as of May 2018.

BUSINESS RETENTION & EXPANSION UPDATE

Ms. Ghaemi provided an update on Swap-It-Up, a new marketing campaign for the Advanced Manufacturing Program (AMP). She reported she is awaiting participation confirmation from Pottsboro and Denison Chambers; presenting to the Whitesboro Chamber Board on July 19th; United Way has agreed to help promote the initiative; scheduling a nonprofit presentation towards the end of July to identify needs; and creating a logo and video. She said the next step is to promote the initiative through community networking events to secure business buy-in.

Mrs. Bates stated the Business Education for Teachers Program has wrapped up, and everyone was pleased with their experience at the local industries and businesses. She said Sherman had 10 teachers in the program this year.

MONTHLY REPORT (June-July 2018)

SEDCO is presently working 9 active projects with an estimated \$165,000,000 in investments and 665 new jobs.

SEDCO hosted four site visits and eight prospect meetings with companies interested in expanding to Sherman.

SEDCO presented the first two incentive payments to Elevate Recoveries, LLC. This payment comes after the company completed the conditions in the SEDCO Economic Development Performance Agreement by gaining their Certificate of Occupancy and hiring 37 employees at their 1900 N Grand Ave. location.

On May 16th, the SEDCO staff presented to the Leadership Sherman Class of 2018 during Economic Development Day.

On May 22nd, SEDCO hosted its Summer Leadership Breakfast with industry representatives and local and state leaders in attendance. This quarterly event includes a round table discussion on the wants, needs and desires of Sherman industries.

On June 7th, Stacey Jones and Emerson Plant Manager and Chairman of the Texoma Manufacturing Consortium, Mark Anderson visited the corporate headquarters of Finisar in Sunnyvale, California to discuss the Advanced Manufacturing Program with Michael Hurlston, CEO.

On June 21st, SEDCO closed on a 23.51-acre property for the new FedEx Freight facility in Progress Park II.

On June 29th, we celebrated Executive Vice President Frank Gadek's 23 years of service and dedication to SEDCO at his Farewell Reception.

On July 9th, SEDCO leadership and staff attended the Finisar Ribbon Cutting.

Business Retention & Expansion

Existing industry visits are critical. Our ongoing program will not only move toward increased relationships with our corporate citizens but is also a valuable resource for referrals within their respective industries. In the past month, we have visited with key leadership from the following Sherman companies: CertainTeed, Emerson, Finisar and GlobiTech.

On June 13th, we sponsored a Plant Managers Forum hosted by Finisar. The following key employers were in attendance: Ball, DPF/Nature's Source, CertainTeed Corporation, Clay Precision, Emerson, GlobiTech, Mueller Construction, Panda Sherman Power and Presco Products.

On May 31st and June 28th, we sponsored a Human Resources Group meeting with the following key employers in attendance: CertainTeed, Douglass Distributing, Eaton, Emerson, Finisar and Presco.

AMP Update

Douglass Distributing donated gas cards to Whitesboro High School for transportation to a summer Grayson College AMP course for the instructor and four students.

AMP students started a summer internship at Emerson sponsored by the Governor's Internship Grant.

Industrial Maintenance Technician Program (IMT) Update

One of our IMT graduates Catherine Ceniceros interviewed at Emerson for a summer internship and was offered a temp to hire position. She accepted and is doing a great job.
