CALL TO ORDER, QUORUM DETERMINED, MEETING DECLARED OPEN, RECOGNITION OF GUESTS, INVOCATION

Mrs. Bates called the meeting to order at 11:34 a.m., declared a quorum present, meeting declared open.

The invocation was given by Mr. Sharp.

Mrs. Bates asked about J.P. Hart Lumber Plant Manager Duane Sanders. Mr. Sharp informed the board he's doing better and that he had a major surgery.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

There were no public comments.

DISCUSS AND CONSIDER APPROVAL OF THE FOLLOWING MINUTES

Motion was made by Ms. Utter and seconded by Mr. Worrell to approve the Regular Scheduled Board Meeting minutes of June 8, 2021. Motion was approved unanimously.

DISCUSS AND CONSIDER APPROVAL OF THE FOLLOWING FINANCIAL REPORTS

Mr. Sharp presented the Balance Sheet, Budget Report, and Commitments for the month ending May 31, 2021 and reported the following:

Cash – SEDCO Checking: \$2,533,833.70

Accounts Payable: \$4,822.12Fund Balance: \$12,093,969.87

• Revenues Over/Under Expenses: \$840,175.86

• Total Liabilities, Equity and Current Surplus (Deficit): \$12,938,967.85

Revenue Total: 92.18%Expense Total: 49.91%

Motion was made by Mr. Bandemir and seconded by Ms. Utter to approve the financial reports for the month ending May 31, 2021. Motion was approved unanimously.

SALES TAX AND ECONOMIC BAROMETER REPORTS

Mr. Sharp reported the July sales tax as \$389,002.67, a 13.89% increase compared to July 2020. He also reported the Cumulative YTD as 13.39%.

Mrs. Bellows presented the June 2021 Economic Barometer Report and reported the following:

- New residential permits dropped 44% compared to June 2020 and saw just over a 3% decrease on the YTD.
 However, commercial and industrial permits jumped 150% compared to June 2020 and increased over 30% on the YTD. The most notable of these was a permit valued at \$560,000 for the construction of an addition to the Child & Family Guidance Center
- The city is up 146 water customers from this time last year.

- Grayson County's month's supply of housing inventory saw another slight increase from 1.3 months in April to 1.4
 months in May.
- Sherman's unemployment rate in May was 5%, down from 5.1% in April.

Mr. Sharp referred to the drop in housing supply and asked if the realtors were still seeing bidding wars on homes. Mr. Hefton said he expects the housing supply to rise by the end of the year but noted how the rain has slowed down development. Mr. Teamann said lots of new housing lots are coming available.

DISCUSSION OF THE PROPOSED FY 2021-2022 SEDCO BUDGET AND PROGRAM OF WORK

Mr. Sharp presented the proposed FY 2021-2022 Program of Work and noted that the target industries and goals have been carried over from FY 2020-2021 with no changes. Mrs. Bates commented on how call centers are still in business but are shifting more to remote work in the presence of COVID-19.

Mrs. Bellows said the only two action items that have been added and impact the budget include 1) the partnership with Workforce Solutions Texoma and the Denison Development Alliance to help fund two Career Education Specialists positions for the student workforce development programs and 2) the continuation of a partnership that started in FY 20-21 with the Center for Workplace Learning to offer no-cost training to full-time employees of Sherman-based, Type A businesses.

Mr. Sharp presented the proposed FY 2021-2022 SEDCO Budget and noted that the budget includes six months of current actual expenses and six months of proposed actual expenses through then end of the fiscal year. He reported on the following budget summary:
